What is Moodle, you ask?

Moodle is an internet based educational environment built for institutions of all sizes. Once logged in to Moodle, you can select to proceed through a lesson assigned to you, or you can discuss it in the message boards, or work with your group on a problem.

- Instructors can design lessons with a great deal of flexibility, from scheduling to forums.
- Moodle is all about social education — students are encouraged to develop an identity within Moodle and interact with other students
- Moodle can operate online distance-learning classes or supplement classroom instruction time
- Instructors can easily embed multimedia in lessons and link to other web resources
- Students can easily submit work for grading and peer review through Moodle
